The Epistle of St. Paul Lutheran Church, The Grove, Texas May 2021

Dear Fellow Redeemed:

As we studied together one day this past week, we heard this illustration from Rick Warren. It resonated with me as I seem to talk about this often.

The illustration reminds us that when the Titanic set sail in 1912, it was declared to be "unsinkable" because it was constructed using a new technology. The ship's hull was divided into sixteen watertight compartments. Up to four of these compartments could be damaged or even flooded, and still the ship would float.

Tragically, the Titanic sank on April 15, 1912 at 2.20 a.m. One thousand five hundred thirteen people lost their lives. At the time, it was thought that five of its watertight compartments had been ruptured in a collision with an iceberg.

However, on September 1, 1985, when the wreck of the Titanic was found lying upright on the ocean floor, there was no sign of the long gash previously thought to have been ripped in the ship's hull. What they discovered was that damage to one compartment affected all the rest.

Many people make the Titanic mistake. They think they can divide their lives into different "compartments." We try to compartmentalize the various aspects thinking they have nothing to do with the rest. What I do on Sunday mornings has no effect on what I do during the week, or so many think. What I do at work is not connected to what I do at home, or so we think. How I live when no one is watching really has no impact on the rest of my life. In short, it is thought that what I do in one compartment of my life will not affect the rest. However, as Rick Warren says, "A life of integrity is one that is not divided into compartments."

David gives us the wonderful example as he prayed for "an undivided heart" in Psalm 86:11. In the Amplified Version of the Bible it reads like this: "Teach me Your way, O LORD, I will walk and live in Your truth; Direct my heart to fear Your name [with awe-inspired reverence and submissive wonder]."

One of the saddest things about a compartmentalized life is to hear, when you tell someone of the death of a friend or coworker who was very active in the church, that they never knew he or she was a Christian or attended a church. And yet from time to time that is exactly what you hear. That is a wakeup call for me.

So, I pray, Heavenly Father, teach me Your way so that I will walk and live in Your truth. Direct my heart to fear Your name with awe-inspired reverence and wonder, even as I live for You in every aspect of my life. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen!

- 6. We will also begin to fill out "Green Cards" again so that we can do a much better job of accounting of the souls for which God has given us responsibility.
- 7. Also on May 2nd we will begin taking Sunday School attendance and receiving our Sunday School Offerings as we have in the past.
- 8. Beginning on May 2nd, we will also begin offering the Common Cup as we celebrate the Lord's Supper for those who would like to receive the blood of Christ in, with, and under the wine that way.
